<b>Target Group</b>	Dislocated fishermen of Lummi Nation located in Bellingham, Washington, who are affected by the ongoing decline of the salmon and shellfish fishing industries.
<b>Project Description</b>	This project will provide reemployment services to individuals impacted by the ongoing decline of the fishing and shellfish industry, which has been declared an economic disaster by the Lummi Indian Business Council for the 2014, and 2015 fishing seasons.
<b>Targeted Occupations</b>	Proposes to train dislocated fisherman for tribal employment opportunities, as well as for off-reservation jobs in high-demand industries such as construction, healthcare, manufacturing, and retail.
<b>Training/Services</b>	Training options will include work-based and on-the-job training opportunities to help transition dislocated fishermen to employment in tribal-owned businesses, as well as classroom training for workers seeking non-tribal employment.
