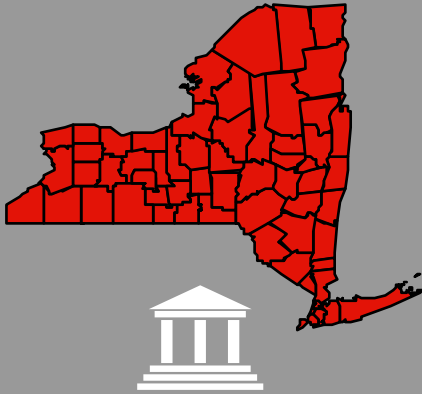

Qualifying Events

The hurricanes caused widespread devastation and extensive infrastructure damage in Puerto Rico and the US Virgin Islands, leaving residents without homes and jobs. Consequently, some of these former residents have relocated to New York, as well as sought reemployment services in order to find work.



Proposal Summary

The New York Department of Labor has submitted an application for \$10,000,000 in National Dislocated Worker Grant (DWG) funds. The purpose of the request is to provide reemployment services to individuals who have relocated to New York after evacuating their homes in the aftermath of Hurricanes Irma and Maria.



Project Description

This project will provide reemployment services for individuals impacted by Hurricanes Irma and Maria who have evacuated to New York. The Federal Emergency Management Agency issued the following declarations in September 2017 for these hurricanes: Puerto Rico Hurricane Irma (DR-4336), Puerto Rico Hurricane Maria (DR-4339), U.S. Virgin Islands Hurricane Irma (DR-4335), and U.S. Virgin Islands Hurricane Maria (DR-4340).
