<b>Project Description</b>	Pennsylvania will build upon the proven industry partnership strategies employed by the workforce investment boards (WIBs) under its On-the-Job Training (OJT) and Dislocated Worker Training (DWT) NEGs to expand job-driven partnerships that are focused on three industry clusters: Advanced Manufacturing, Energy and Healthcare. Partnerships include the local workforce development and economic development agencies, as well as local employer-based training consortiums. The commonwealth will offer work-based training strategies such as OJT, customized training, Registered Apprenticeship programs, and pre-apprenticeship programs to prepare workers for jobs in the targeted occupations. Training services will be supported by job counseling, job coaching, and occupational skills training. General Education Development (GED) certificates and soft skills training will also be offered through the Adult Basic Education Career Pathways program. Pennsylvania is the second-largest resource field in the world and will create additional jobs with the discovery and ability to recover natural gas in the Marcellus Shale Region. The
