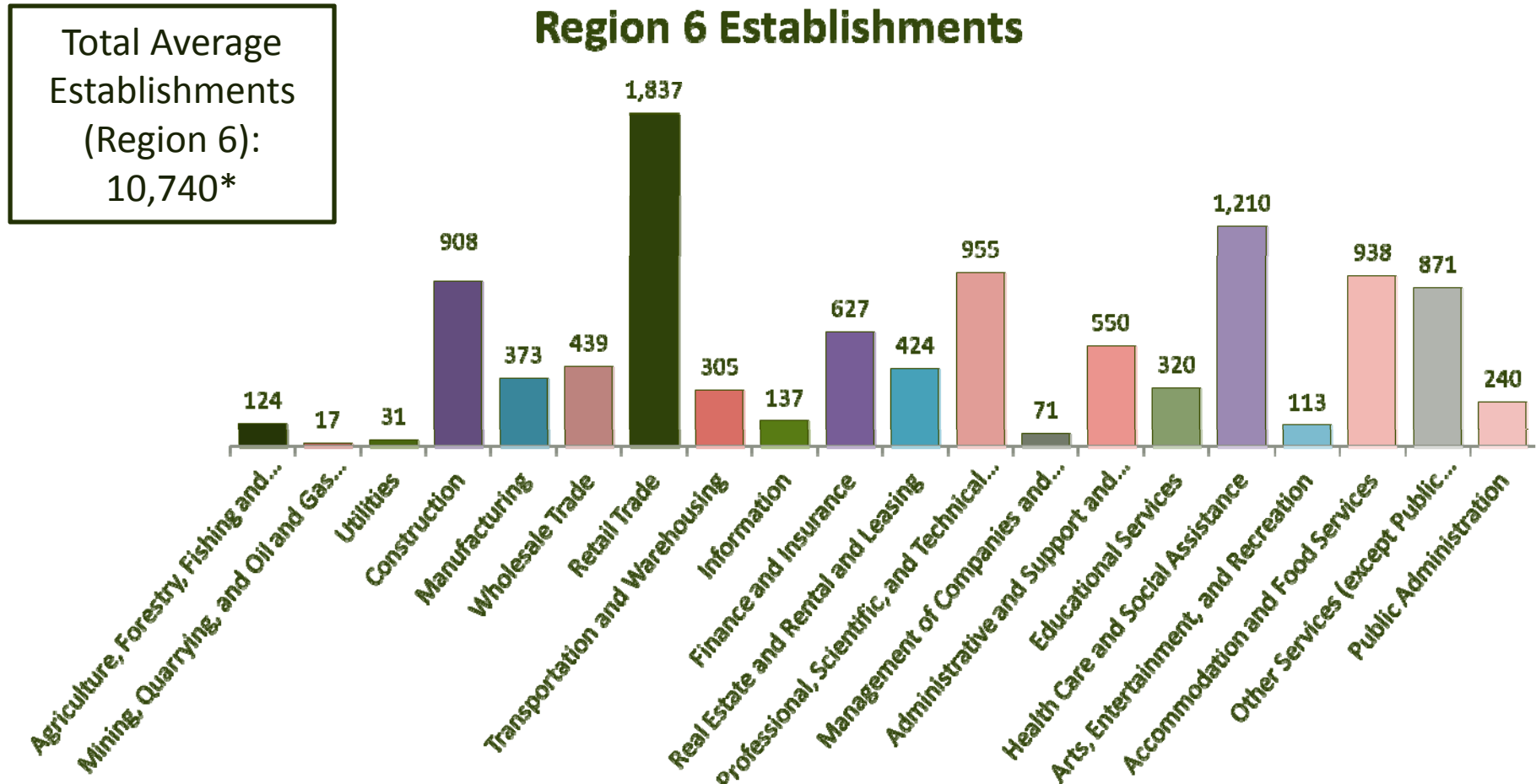

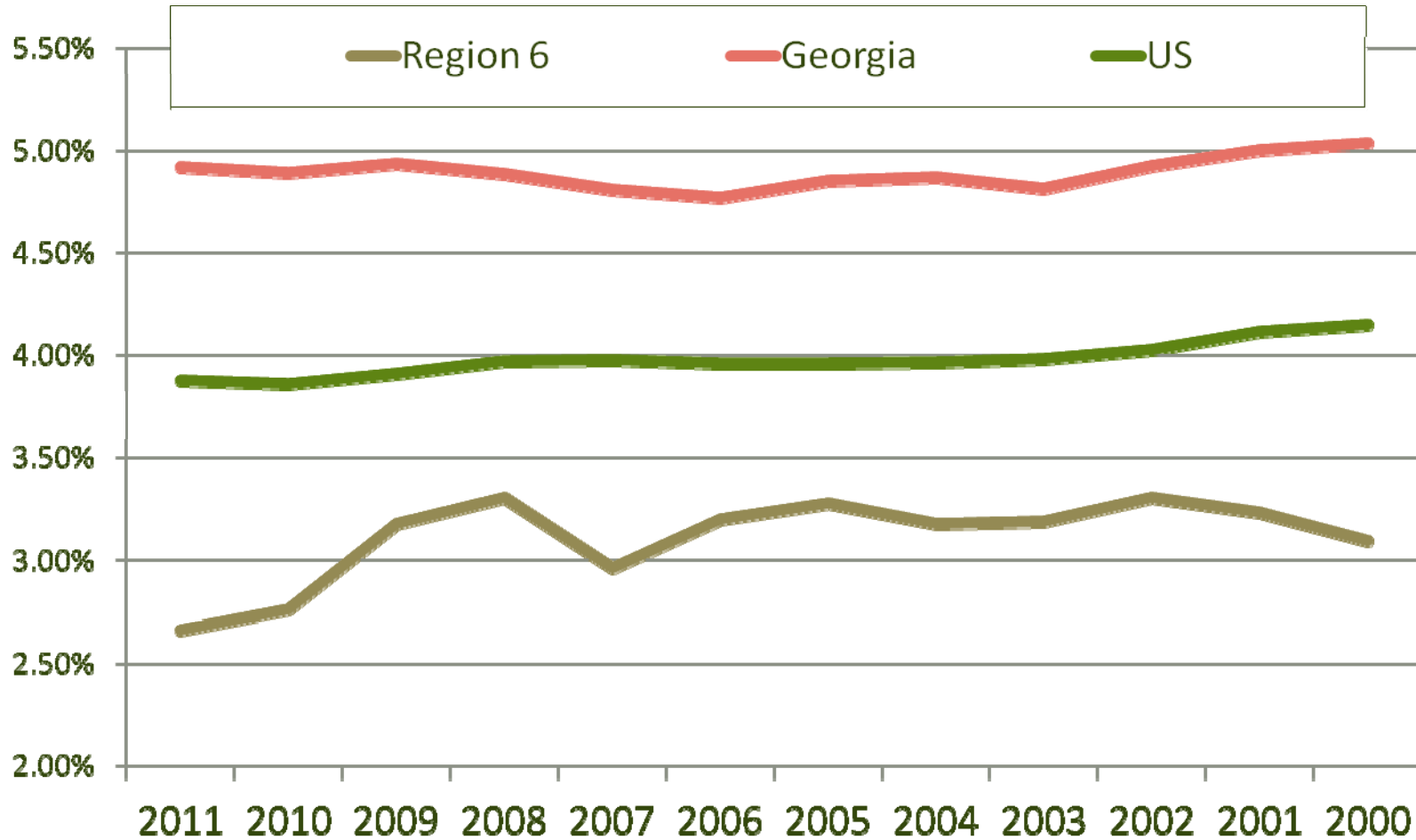
# 2011 Industry Mix

# Percentage of Transportation and Warehousing Employment Over Time

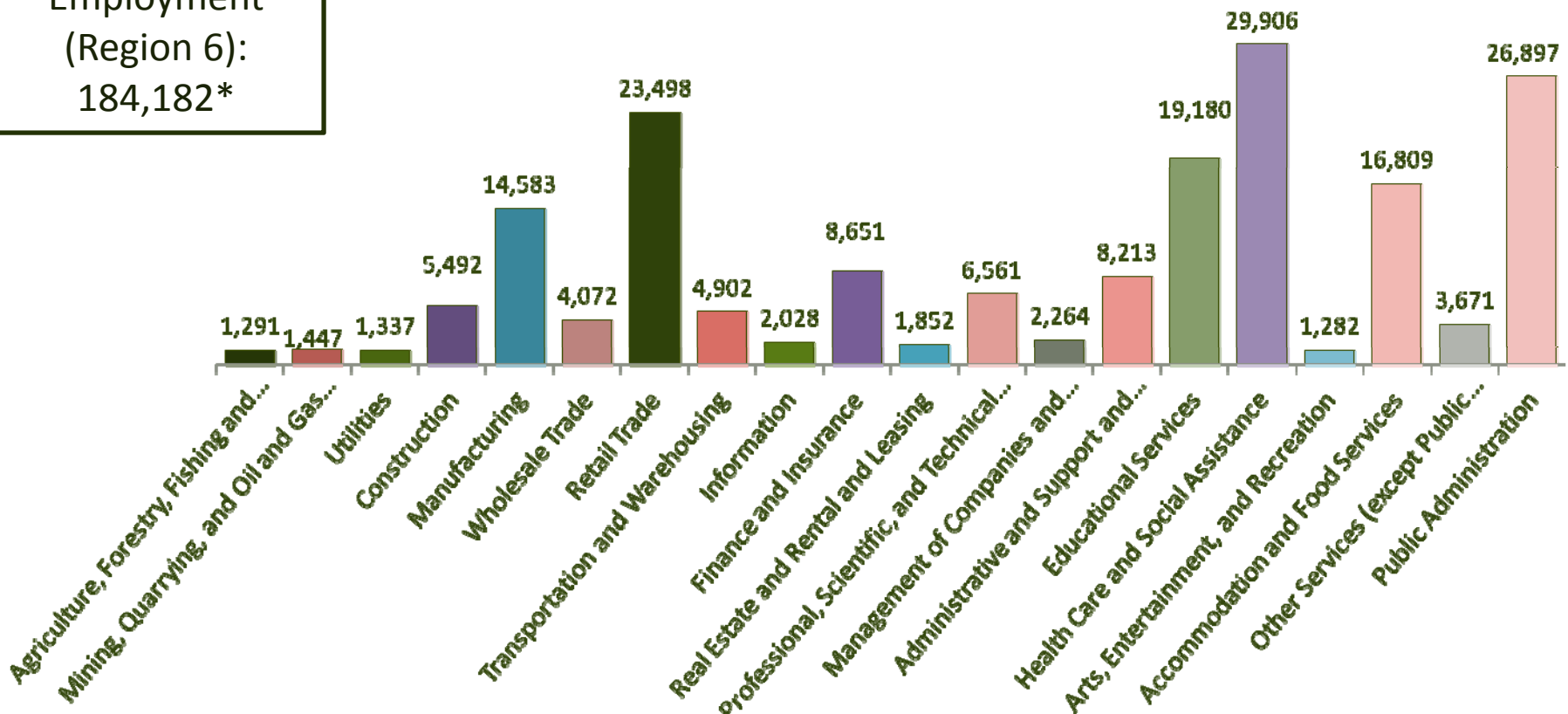

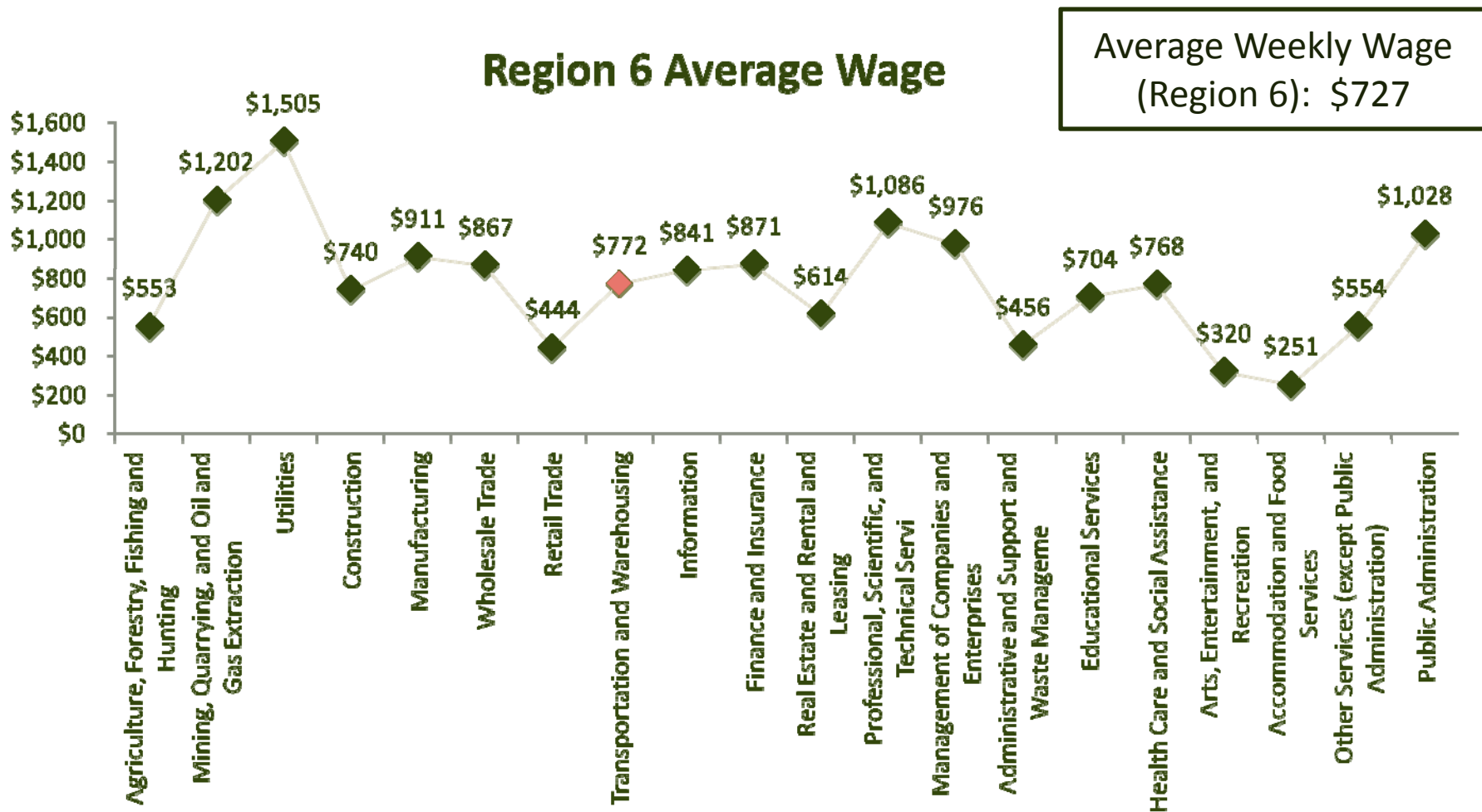

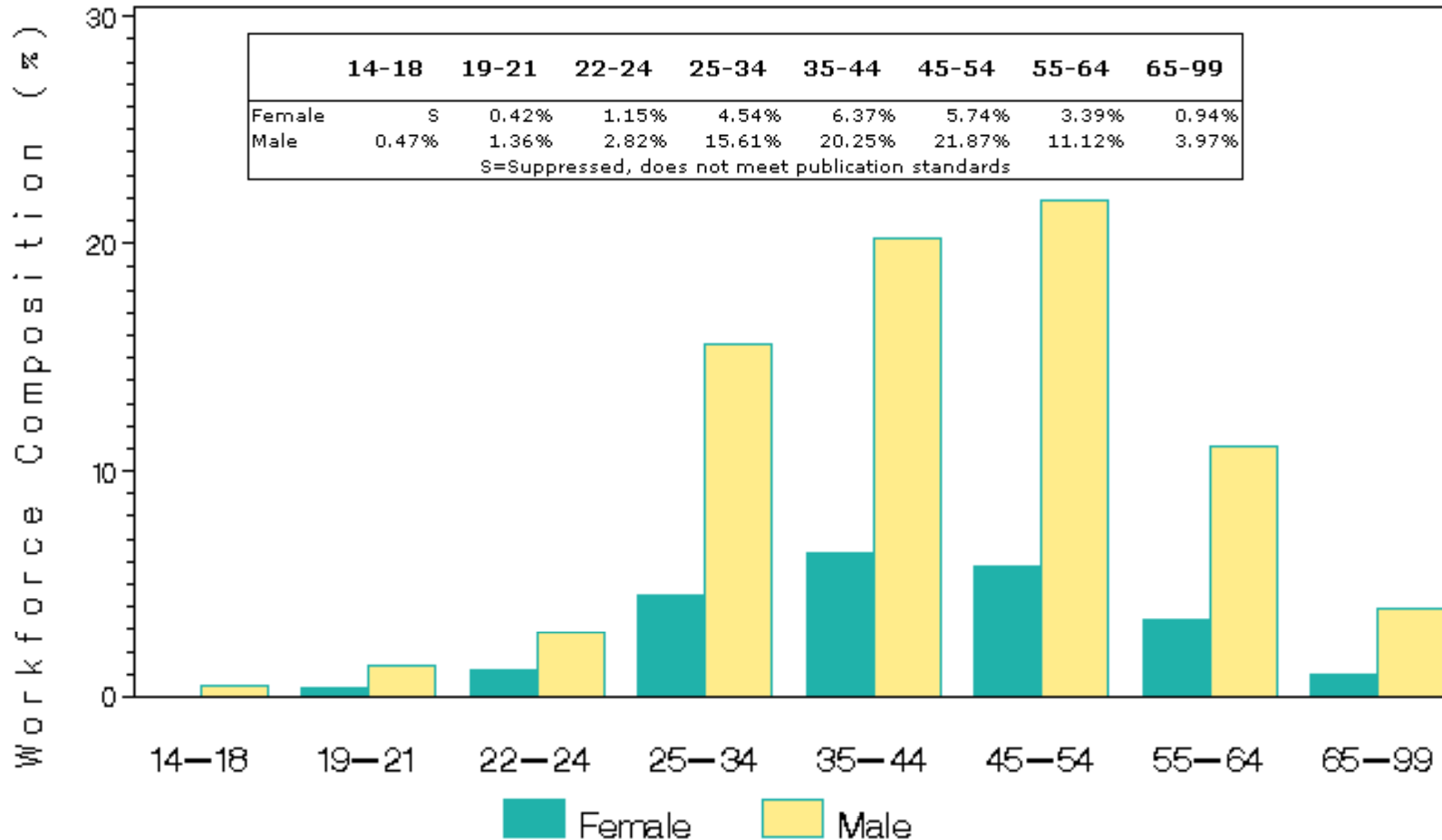
