PRDOL has updated the Workforce Information Database with the most recent 2.6.1 version according to the Analyst Resource Center (ARC). The primary purpose of the WIDb is to serve as the repository of labor market and other economic information for Puerto Rico Labor Market Information (LMI).

The core tables are updated with crosswalk style now used by the National Crosswalk Service Center, Local Employment and Wages Information System (LEWIS) and Estimates Data System (EDS) software.

III. Puerto Rico 2nd Annual LMI Conference -STEM

During FY 2015-2016 the Second Annual LMI Conference in Puerto Rico took place. After evaluating Puerto Rico's on-demand occupations, the following was determined:

- To dedicate the conference to the STEM theme (science technology, engineering, and mathematics) those have turned out to be the occupations with the highest demand.
- That the population we intend to cause an impact on would be high school students and their teachers; because these are the students currently studying in Puerto Rico's STEM-related academic institutions.

We met with Puerto Rico's Secretary of Education, Mr. Rafael Román, so as to present him with a copy of our proposal. He was pleased with it and reached a very enthusiastic agreement to participate with our Secretary of Labor, Mr. Vance Thomas, Esq., bringing in the direct participation of the public education system and its student body.

To speak about ETA's STEM initiatives, Mr. James Sibley, Deputy Commissioner for BLS at the Boston Regional Office was present. We also had the pleasure of counting with the presence of Ms. Deborah Brown, BLS Regional Commissioner at the USDOL's Boston Regional Office.

Assistant Secretary for Planning, Research and Development at the Puerto Rico Department of Labor, Mrs. Silvia Soto-Pérez presented the LMI web page [www.mercadolaboral.pr.gov]. The purpose was to inform everyone where they may obtain the statistical information included in Mr. Sibley's presentation and any other information that may assist them regarding STEM-related occupations, when looking for a job; where to look for our services; and others. With this objective at hand, we came to decide and include, as part of our web page, a new STEM area where users will find segregated information by category: Students, Statistics, Teachers, Children, Federal Funding Opportunities, and News. All the new information is STEM-related, available at: <http://www.mercadolaboral.pr.gov/STEM/STEM.aspx>. With this, we will provide information regarding STEM occupations in order to help students when making occupational decisions; to teachers: offer them tools with which to help students in the classroom; and to younger children beginning to explore these occupational careers: present STEM in a user friendly style. On the other hand, but on the same spot, we will offer federal funding opportunities information with the purpose of expanding these occupational careers. This edition is dedicated to STEM, and in the inside one may find statistically-oriented articles related to STEM, including information about statistics and organizations that are STEM related, in Puerto Rico. As a special guest, Dr. Lester Morales, a Professional Education Development Specialist from NASA at the Kennedy Space Center will be present, in order to share his views as parts of the Conference, with a presentation entitled Cool Careers on the Final Frontier. IV. Customer Satisfaction Survey

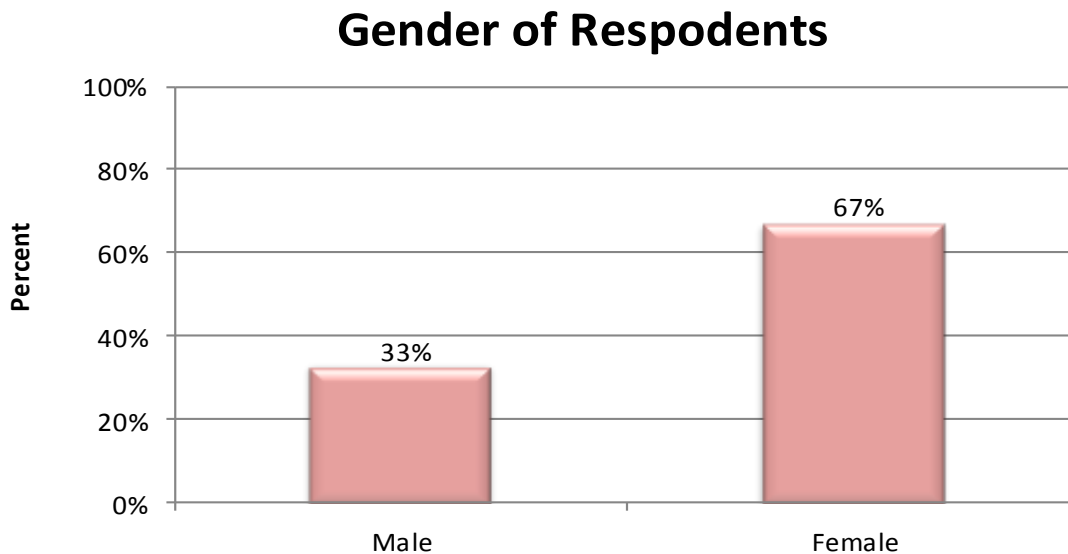
The Labor Market Information (LMI) Division of the Puerto Rico Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) annually develops a Customer Satisfaction Survey (CSS). It consists of a questionnaire targeted toward users of state workforce statistics and the Bureau's publications, sponsored by the Puerto Rico Department of Labor (PRDOL). The survey measures the users' perception of the publications and BLS surveys.

The purpose of the CSS survey is to:

- Improve information services for our customers;
- Evaluate the quality of the information produced, enhancing as much as possible, the information requested by our clients;
- Comply with the required deliverables from our federal funding sources, and explore the system users' satisfaction level, regarding the information provided by us.

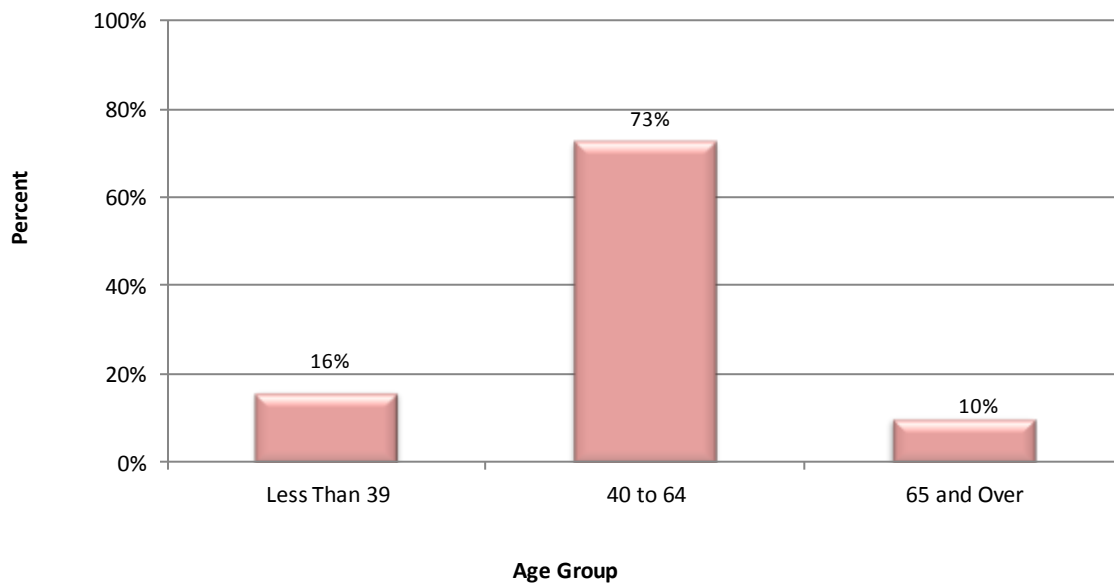
A total of 411 questionnaires were sent during a three-month period from April 5 to June 30, 2016. After follow-ups, 73 answered questionnaires were received with a response rate of 17.8 percent.

In this document we present the results of the survey, with added comments and recommendations from our customers.



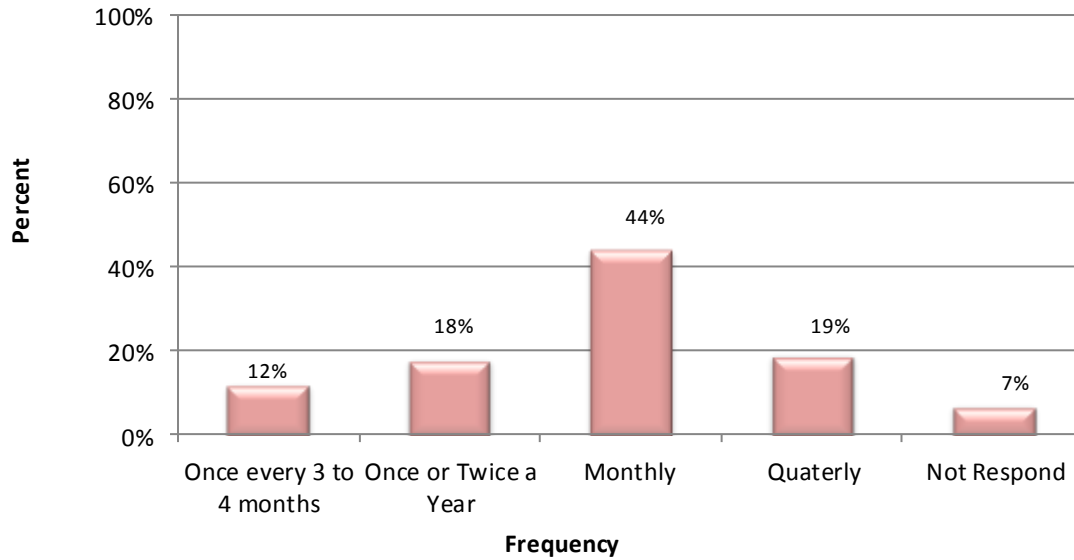
The age distribution is classified from less than 18 years old, to 65 years olds and over, in different age group categories. The largest group of users is in the 40-64 years old range, or 73.0 percent. This indicates that we have mature customers as the main users our labor market information products.

Age of Respondents



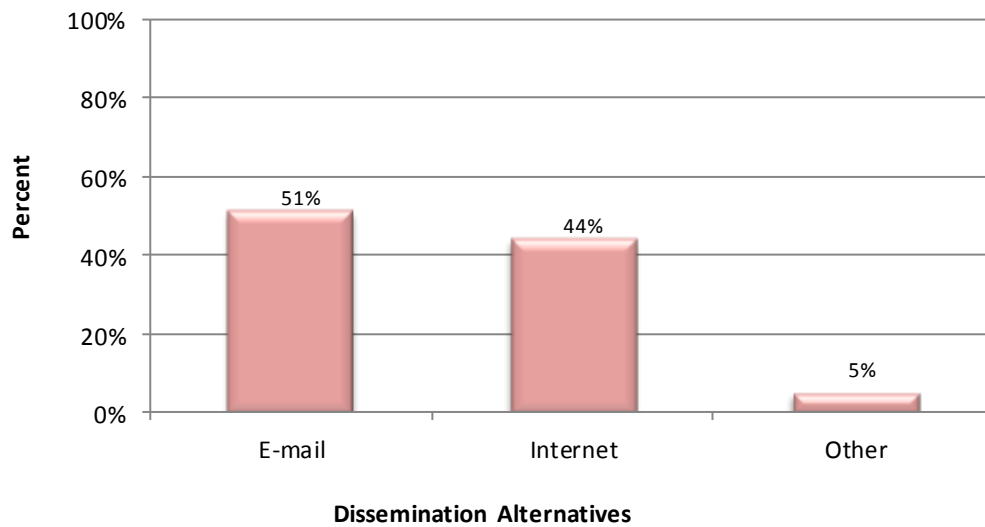
Forty four percent (44%) of our customers access our information on a monthly basis. According to our records, they are mainly public administration workers, labor market planners and students. Quarterly frequency represents 19 percent of our users. The third group of approximately 18 percent uses the system once or twice a year; the 12 percent information request every three to four months. The 7 percent not reply this questions.

Frequency of Information Request

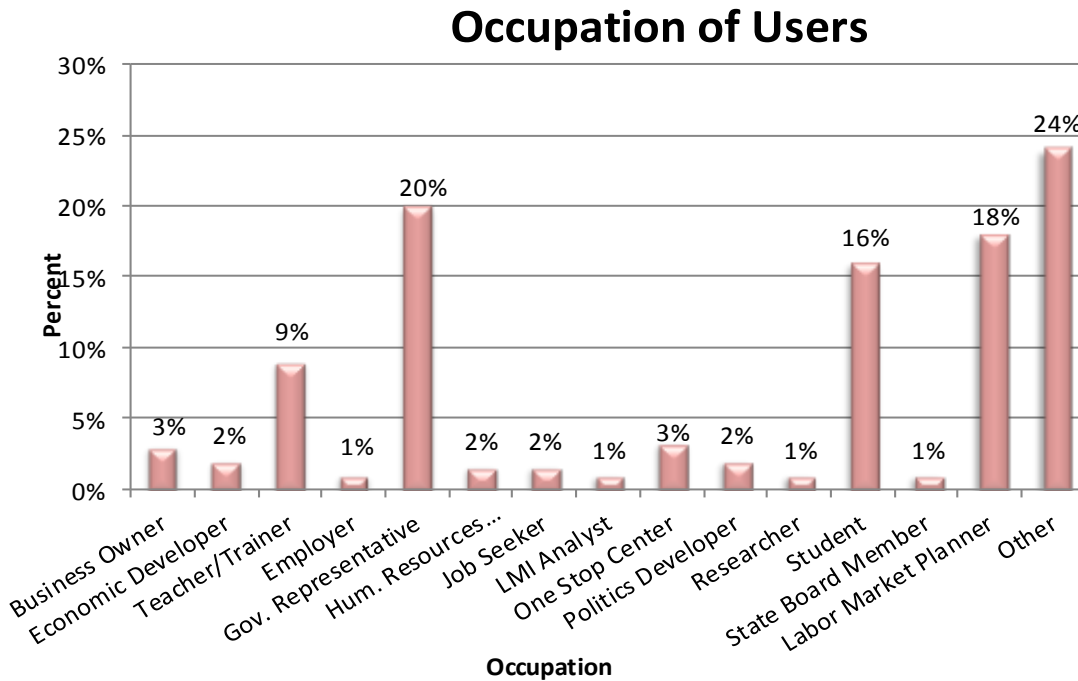


The most frequent method for the dissemination of information is by e-mails, used by 51 percent of the users, while 44 percent use the internet as a direct access of the information.

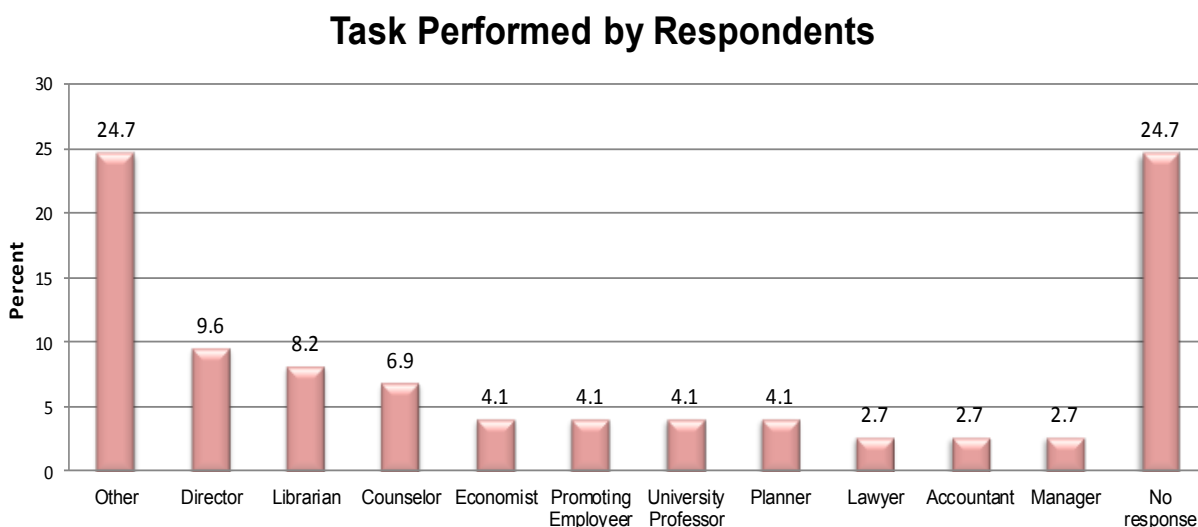
Dissemination Information



In terms of the occupations of those answering the survey, in general, 20.0 percent were government representatives who use the information mainly for grant application development, public policy determination, or other types of research. Labor Market Planners represent 18.0 percent of the users. Our respondents chose more than one alternative in questions number 4).

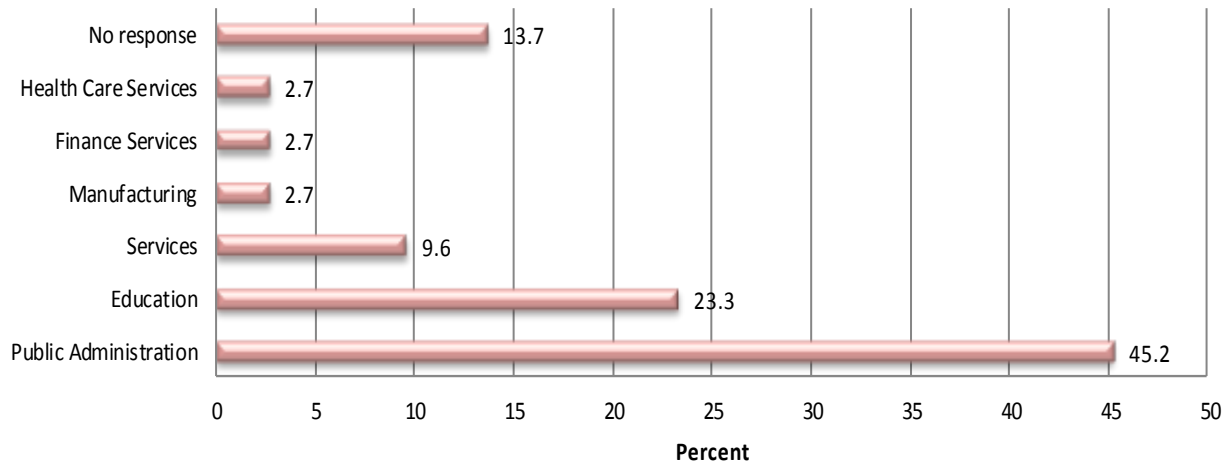


Question number 6 inquires more precisely about the functions or tasks performed by the respondents in their current employment. From the 73 regular information users, 55 responded to this question, representing 75.0 percent of the total possible answers. Most of the respondent's functions were Director (9.6%) and Librarian (8.2%). The next one was Counselor with 6.9 percent. This indicates that the top users of our information are those performing professional functions at their current occupation.



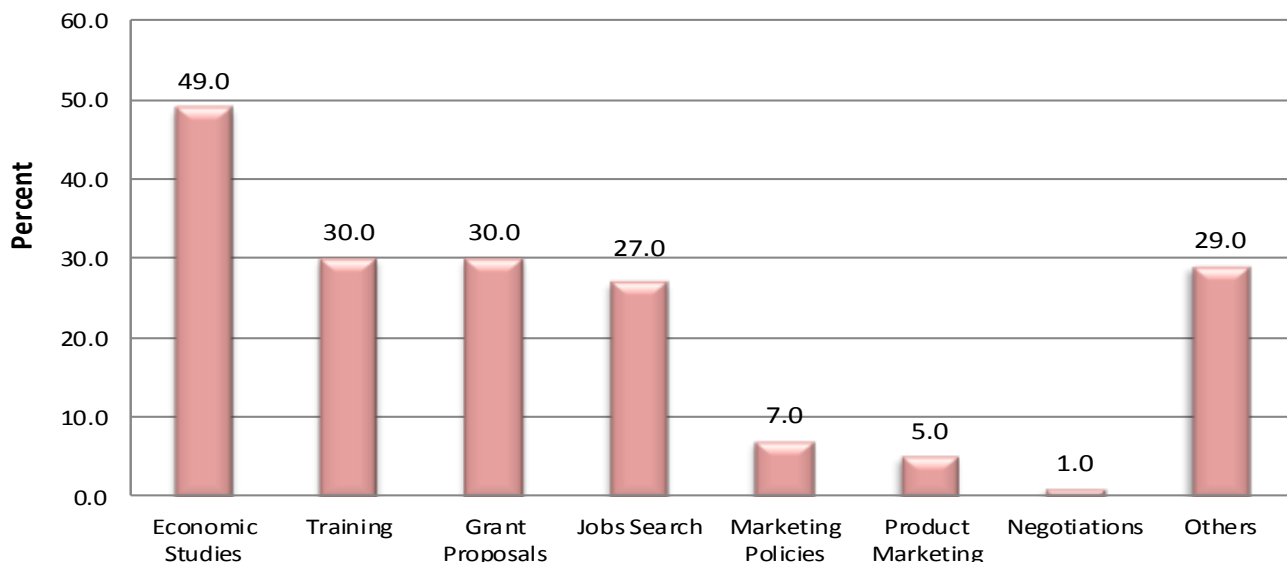
In terms of the industry the interviewees identified their tasks with the following industries: Public Administration was the most identified industry within our respondents, representing 45.2 percent of total respondents. The government industry was followed by that of Education Services with 23.3 percent and Services with 9.6 percent.

Industry of User



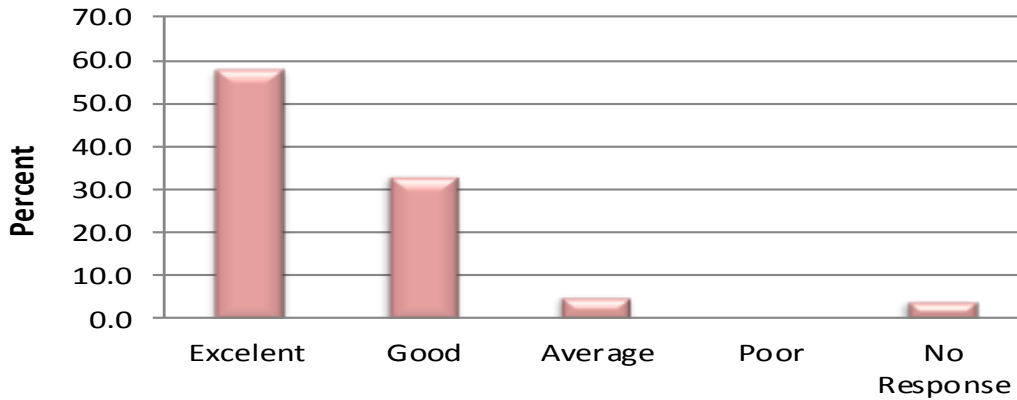
The most common uses for the LMI information requested were for the performance of Economic Studies with 49.0 percent. Training and Grant Proposals with 30.0 percent each. Again based on our records, these are mainly media reporters, governmental employees and consultants.

Purpose of the Information



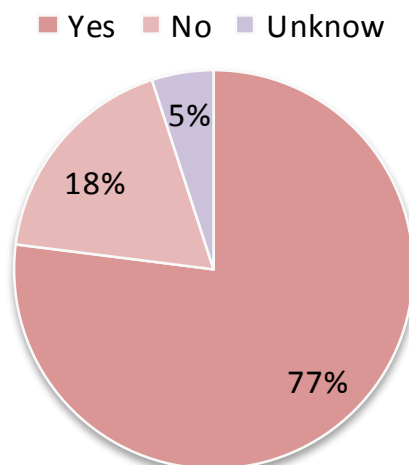
Upon asking about the evaluation of services provided by the Puerto Rico Bureau of Labor Statistics the results were very positive. The Excellent Category received 58.0 percent of the responses, and 33.0 percent rated our services as Good. This states that 91percent of our users rated our services between Excellent and Good. Only five percent rated the services as Average.

V. Activities Undertaken to Meet Customer Needs

With the main purpose of disseminating LMI information so that our users may be able to make decisions based on real and updated data, we participated in trainings and job fairs; and offered our own LMI conferences and workshops. At the trainings and job fairs, informative literature was handed out as part of the WIG deliverables, along with the Guidelines for using our LMI web page at: <http://www.mercadolaboral.pr.gov/lmi/pdf/Guia%20pagina%20LMI.pdf>. At the conferences, topics such as: occupations, wages, job skills, and projections, among others, were discussed; while at the workshops, participants were trained on how to use the information so that it may help them make occupational decisions.
